#### Bounce messages



Delivery to the following recipient failed permanently:

hopelesscowsalad@hotmail.com

Technical details of permanent failure: Google tried to deliver your message, but it was rejected by the server for the recipient domain hotmail.com by mx3.hotmail.com. [65.54.188.126].

The error that the other server returned was: 550 Requested action not taken: mailbox unavailable

# Problem

- 1. User email out-of-date
- 2. Mail is bouncing
- 3. No keeping track of the bounces
  - $\Rightarrow$  Website keeps sending
  - $\Rightarrow$  Less delivery rate
  - $\Rightarrow$  Spam reputation

"Anything above 10% [...] will raise red flags with your ISP"

# Solution strategy

- 1. Define a Return-Path mailbox
- 2. Fetch messages
- 3. Detect a bounce
- 4. Set a flag on the user
- 5. Suppress further sending

#### Solution strategy, generalized

- 1. Fetch each message
- 2. Run *analyzers* on it, retrieve a *result*
- 3. Run handlers with the result

One analyzer for detecting bounces One handler for setting the mute flag

A mail alter hook for suppressing muted users

Ingredients:

- 1. A per-user send state
- 2. A mail alter hook

#### Mailmute: Send state

- Plugins
- Hierarchically ordered
- May be muting

# Inmail

- 1. Fetch message
- 2. Parse message
- 3. Run each analyzer
  - a. Report results
- 4. Run each handler
  - a. Perform actions depending on the result object

#### Standard DSN Analyzer

Simple approach: follow a standard! RFC 3463 + RFC 3464

- 1. Identifies a status code (e.g. 5.7.1)
- 2. Identifies the recipient
- 3. Extracts a "reason" message

#### 3.2 Address Status

**RFC 3463** 

X.1.0 Other address status

Something about the address specified in the message caused this DSN.

X.1.1 Bad destination mailbox address

The mailbox specified in the address does not exist. For Internet mail names, this means the address portion to the left of the " $\ell$ " sign is invalid. This code is only useful for permanent failures.

X.1.2 Bad destination system address

The destination system specified in the address does not exist or is incapable of accepting mail. For Internet mail names, this means the address portion to the right of the "" is invalid for mail. This code is only useful for permanent failures.

X.1.3 Bad destination mailbox address syntax

The destination address was syntactically invalid. This can apply to any field in the address. This code is only useful for permanent failures.

X.1.4 Destination mailbox address ambiguous

The mailbox address as specified matches one or more recipients

If the analyzers identified a bounce Then set the send state to mute

Introduce new send states

Soft bounce (4.x.x)

Hard bounce (5.x.x)

- Set to Counting bounces
  After 5 bounces, set to Temporarily Unreachable
- Set to Invalid Address

- Set to Counting bounces
  After 5 bounces, set to Temporarily Unreachable
- Set to Invalid Address
